Remember From Here to Fraternity?

What could The Country Bears and Coyote Ugly possibly have in common? How about Seinfeld, Friends, and 3rd Rock from the Sun? What they and many other TV shows, commercials, and comedy venues have in common is our own Chip Chinery '86.

"I haven't had a real job in 16 years," claims Chinery who has been in LA since 1994 seeking fame and fortune. We won't talk about the fortune part, but he is certainly winning his share of fame.

of Cincinnati for Miami University to study psychology; not a bad choice actually for a life in comedy. Chinery had heard about Delta Tau Delta from a cousin, but it was really the great times he had with the brothers that made DTD his choice. Brothers will remember that he had a video camera constantly aimed at ... well, just about everything. Reality TV? Nothing new for **Chinery**. DTD was prime material for his early movie productions.

His very first production was "The Making of Pumpkin," a 10-minute short documenting the fraternity house's transformation for the fall date costume party. The success of that junior year project led to "The Delt Time Capsule 1985-1986" aka "From Here to Fraternity," a day-by-day, year-in-the-life documentary of his senior year at the Delt house.

"I am currently digitizing the original video and have offered the DVD to Gamma Upsilon Chapter as a fund-raising perk for when our chapter returns to Miami in Fall 2005," notes Chinery.

Life in the fraternity was great fun, but with graduation, Chinery started what he expected to be his serious career. "After college, I tried my hand at lots of things," he says. "I was a TV cameraman for about 20 months. I continued doing

stand-up comedy at places like Ozzie's in Oxford. Along the way, several parents of fraternity brothers purchased a copy of the fraternity documentary. One parent replied suggesting that I contact him if I ever wanted to change careers. Long story short, I became the Director of Communications for TheBankMart in Bridgeport, CT."

But the job just didn't fit right. What did fit was comedy and a life that to some might seem uncertain not knowing where or what the next job will

be. "The way I look at it, just about everybody is always only two weeks' notice away from not knowing where their next paycheck is coming from. I was touring the country performing stand-up; I was booked at least six months out; and I got to do what I loved."

After nine years of touring 45 weeks a year, **Chinery** got tired of life on the road. In 1997, he booked his first TV shows and commercials. You may have seen him as a college professor in a Mazda commercial or maybe in a kilt praising Sierra Mist. He has an upcoming part as a milkman on FOX's That 70s Show. He still enjoys doing stand-up comedy whenever he can and even played a part in American Idol
